



## 1.2 FAI Registered Testing Pool

- RTP 2014
  - RTP Protocols (way RTP is created) and Whereabouts Procedures reviewed and updated
  - ASC Presidents informed about procedure
  - ASC concerned by RTP 2014 invited to submit names for inclusion in the RTP right after GC
  - RTP to be finalized by mid-November
  - FAI intention to provide an evidence-based argument to WADA during 2014
    - desired outcome : to relieve FAI of the requirement to conduct Out-of-Competition testing



## 1.3 FAI Anti-Doping Advisory Group (ADAG)

- Small group of persons providing expert knowledge and input from the component membership structure of the FAI
- Initially : created by the FAI General Conference, to advise the FAI EB on the fine-tuning of the FAI Anti-Doping Plan
- Now : continued to provide oversight for these actions and political support to the Anti-Doping Manager (ADM)



## 1.3 FAI Anti-Doping Advisory Group (ADAG)

- Composition
  - one person from the FAI EB, who shall serve as chairperson
  - one ASC President, or an appropriate ASC representative  
= authority to represent all ASCs
  - one NAC President, or an appropriate NAC representative  
= authority to represent all NACs
  - one FAI Athlete, who has previously been part of the FAI RTP
  - the CIMP President, or substitute, will be a corresponding member of the ADAG, with responsibility for providing specialist advice on any anti-doping matters as they may relate to aviation medicine and medical matters.

## 1.4 FAI Doping Review Panel

- Article 7.1.2.1 of the FAI Anti-Doping Rules : “the FAI Executive Board is required to form a Doping Review Panel (DRP) to investigate any Adverse Analytical Findings (AAF) relating to the testing of an A-sample”
- Composition: a Chair and four other persons selected from the following list as appropriate:
  - FAI Anti-Doping Manager (ADM), who shall chair the DRP
  - Members of the FAI ADAG (except that the ASC representative or NAC representative shall stand down should an athlete from their specific aviation sport discipline or nation be involved in the AAF).
  - A representative from the specific aviation sport discipline (selected at the time that the FAI ADM is notified of the AAF)
  - A representative from SportAccord with specialist legal knowledge relating to anti-doping and the WADA Code

#### Who or what is WADA?

The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) is an independent foundation created through a collective initiative led by the International Olympic Committee (IOC). It was set up on November 10, 1999 to promote, coordinate and monitor the fight against drugs in sport. WADA is responsible for the World Anti-Doping Code, adopted by more than 800 sports organizations, including international sports federations, national anti-doping organizations, the IOC, and the International Paralympic Committee.

The FAI has been signatory of the World Anti-Doping Code since 2003.

#### I am practicing my sport as a hobby. Why is anti-doping related to my sport?

Anti-Doping programmes seek to preserve what is intrinsically valuable about sport – fair-play and integrity. Following the adoption in 2003 by the FAI General Conference of the World Anti-Doping Code, the FAI is committed to a programme of anti-doping. The FAI Anti-Doping Rules and Procedures are designed to implement FAI's responsibilities under the World Anti-Doping Code.

#### There are no performance enhancing drugs in my sport. Why does the FAI follow what WADA is dictating?

The FAI wants to ensure that a fair and level playing field. Also, as an Olympic recognized federation, the FAI has to observe the WADA Code and be compliant. Not doing this would result in losing this recognition and, as a consequence, many FAI Members would also lose their national recognition and support from their governments.
